"Northland Healers" who in partnership with "Nourish & Grow" Homeschoolers created an amazing event at Taipa's "The Barn" recently.

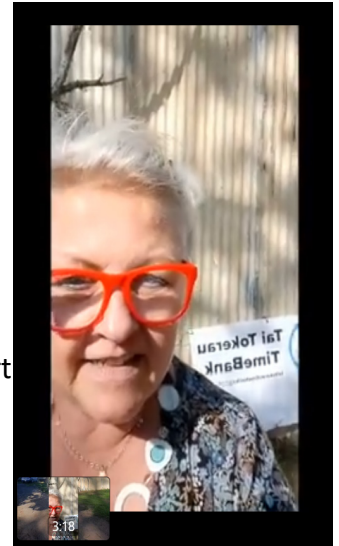
How do we heal? How are we creating this 'new' way of being? What are our communities and how can we bring them even closer together?

Cleaning up

It all started with a Request from Di Maxwell...

"Request: Help cleaning up a reserve area at Haruru Falls: We have an old (80 yr olds) couple who are cleaning up the reserve at the back of their house. Note, this is not their land, they just want to clean out the rubbish along the creek. They have come up against some work too heavy for them to handle, so we are going to help them on Sunday 24th at 10am for a couple hours. Would love some extra help if anyone is available. I am happy to use my timebank hours for this project.

Will need gloves, maybe chopping tools if you want, but just brute force will do a lot. We have a big pile of rubbish (looks like someone has used it for their rubbish dump, disintegrating rubbish bags etc) to remove, then a chop back of noxious vegetation. We will bring a trailer and a wheelbarrow, and will take it to the dump.

If you can help, meet us at 325 Puketona Rd at 10am Sunday. This is at the bottom of the passing lane on the opposite side to the Twin Pines."

Bay of Islands coordinator Jane Edwards commented afterwards "I feel thoroughly uplifted! And sometimes that is the point. This morning a few of us made quick work of large pile of someone else's rubbish in a reserve. This was NEVER going to degrad! Or at least not in our lifetime. And then we shared tea, stories, ideas and knowledge. It feels like this is how it should be. Mahi and then celebration of the Mahi. Thank-you to those who came."

Of course we don't need individuals to use their own timecredits to pay out for events like this (although if you want to that's fine!) as that is the kind of thing our Community Fund is for. If you have a local area that is in need of some TLC and want to hold a Working Bee you can either post a Request like Di did, or contact your local coordinator to help you arrange something.

There is a toilet inside their home which is available.

As this is obviously an outdoor event, it means we will need good weather!

Garden Bomb Squad working bees

Can I sign you up for the official Te Hiku Garden Bomb Squad? There will be monthly Garden Bomb Squad working bees. There is no obligation to come to each session, all I ask is that you please RSVP yes or no to me for each event so I can make sure I have a head count and enough people.

I'm still in the beginning stages of getting this going, but the gist is that it will mostly be held on the 1st Saturday of each month, unless the first weekend is a long weekend, in which case it will be the next weekend. We'll aim for the morning, but some projects may call for a full day affair.

I wanted to start this project as I saw a need of Timebankers wanting help in their home or work gardens but just don't have the time, energy, or health to tackle it just themselves. So, that's where we can come in, as a team!

You'll all get timecredits for the amount of time you spend helping, and those of you not yet on Timebank I am tracking your hours manually right now until I get you sorted and signed up!

The regions we may cover will be throughout all of Te Hiku, and carpooling is always welcomed and encouraged!

The first garden was Jatinder's in Kaitāia where we cleared 5 trailerloads of green waste! Tasks included pruning, weeding, removing invasives and tidying up building debris. The cuppas and snacks and chances to get to know each other better were a welcome bonus!

The next garden we'll have coming up is the one outside of Kaitāia Gymnastics. The owner is recovering from chemotherapy at the moment and needs our help. Are you keen?

There's lots of moth plant needing removed so wear old clothes as the sap stains, and bring gloves as some folk find it irritates their skin.
